PSAC Football - Week 11 Notes - 11/4/09

Quick Hits

- Shippensburg will host California in the PSAC championship game on Saturday, which will be televised live on the PA SportsFever Network at 1:00 p.m.

- Shippensburg earned its first PSAC divisional title since 2004 and its first outright title since 1981.

- California is the champion on the PSAC West for the fifth straight season and is the outright champion for the third straight year.

- Shippensburg is the first team other than Bloomsburg or West Chester to win at least a share of the PSAC East title since East Stroudsburg in 2003.

- The Red Raiders are also the first team to win the PSAC East outright other than West Chester or Bloomsburg since Millersville in 1998.

- This will be the fourth all-time appearance in the PSAC championship game for Cal, and its second straight. The Vulcans are 2-0-1 all-time in the PSAC championship game, winning last year and in 1984 and tying in 1968.

- This will be the third all-time appearance in the PSAC championship game for Ship, and its first since 1981. The Red Raiders are 1-0-1 all-time in the PSAC championship game, winning in 1981 and tying in 1976.

- The PSAC championship game was reinstated last year after having not been played since 1987.

- Slippery Rock's Kyle Witman is ranked fourth in the country in average yards per punt. With a big punting day on Saturday, he can become the second straight PSAC player to lead the country in punting after East Stroudsburg's Nick Krut did so last year.

- Slippery Rock held Lock Haven to -4 yards of total offense in its win last week. The performance by the Rock defense is the best in a single game in all of Division II this year, and they are the only team that has held an opponent to negative yardage in a single game this year.

- That performance by Rock overtook IUP for the top single-game defensive performance this year, as the Crimson Hawks held Lock Haven to just one yard of total offense on October 17, which is the second-best performance by a defense in the country this year.

- Gannon and Slippery Rock combined for 99 points in Gannon's 51-48 win in Week 8. That game marked the most combined points in a game involving a PSAC team or teams since a pair of games that were played on September 10, 2005. On that day, 100 points were scored in California's 88-12 win over Mansfield and 115 points were scored in East Stroudsburg's 66-49 win over C.W. Post, which was then not a member of the PSAC in football.

- Cheyney QB Angel Rodriguez ran for a PSAC season-high 207 yards on October 10. Although the last QB in the PSAC to run for over 200 yards in a game is currently unavailable, Rodriguez is believed to be the first PSAC QB in this decade to run for over 200 yards in a game.

- Kutztown kicker Matt Dineen kicked five field goals in the Golden Bears' win over Cheyney in Week 6. He is the first kicker since East Stroudsburg's Greg Knauss in 2007 to make five FGs in a game.

- Bloomsburg K Jon Koenig is one of just nine kickers in the country that have made a field goal from 50 yards or beyond this year.

- Five different PSAC players have recorded three sacks in a game so far this year through 10 games: Josh Simmons and Andy Horn of Shippensburg, Justin Presley of Bloomsburg, Fred Hale of Mercyhurst, and Jeff Case of East Stroudsburg, who did it last week. Only two players recorded at least three sacks in a game all of last year: Jon Ochs of Bloomsburg and Mike Perillo of Edinboro.

- Three PSAC teams - West Chester, California and C.W. Post - scored 50 or more points in Week 4 wins on September 19. That did not happen last year and it marked the first time since Week 2 of the 2007 season (Sept. 7-8) that three different PSAC teams scored 50 or more in the same week. In that week in 2007, East Stroudsburg, Edinboro and IUP each scored 50 or more.

PSAC With Three Teams Ranked in Each Poll

Edinboro dropped out of both polls this week while Shippensburg entered both, leaving the PSAC with three teams ranked in each poll. The three in the AFCA poll is tied for the second-most of any conference while the three in the D2football.com poll is tied for the third most of any conference. The

PSAC Players of the Week - Nov. 1 (Week 10)

PSAC East Offensive Player of the Week Eric Anderkavich, C.W. Post QB, Jr., Queens, N.Y./Holy Cross

Anderkavich accounted for all six of C.W. Post's touchdowns and 367 yards of total offense in a 42-17 win over Kutztown. He completed 21-of-33 passes (63.6 percent) for 302 yards and four TDs without an interception and was only sacked just once. He was also Post's leading rusher on the day, gaining 65 yards on just 11 attempts (5.9 ypc) with two TDs. Anderkavich threw two TD passes in the first quarter, both from 25 yards or more, to give the Pioneers a 14-0 lead less than five minutes into the game. He added a four-yard TD strike and a 26-yard TD run in the second quarter, giving Post a 28-10 lead at the half, and he then threw a 15-yard pass and ran one in from two yards out in the third quarter to wrap up the scoring.

PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week Mike Dell, West Chester LB, Sr., Hummelstown, Pa./Lower Dauphin

Dell led the West Chester defensive effort against Bloomsburg that held the Huskies to a season-low 47 rushing yards and just 3-of-11 on third down conversions, helping the Golden Rams defeat Bloomsburg for the third straight time in the regular season. Dell recorded nine tackles, including seven solo, had a tackle for loss that was a sack, and a forced fumble along with two quarterback hurries. The forced fumble came on Bloomsburg's final drive of the game, sealing the victory for the Golden Rams.

PSAC West Offensive Player of the Week Tyler Huether, Clarion QB, Sr., Irwin, Pa./Penn Trafford

Huether totaled 260 yards of total offense and three touchdowns as he helped lead Clarion to a 30-17 win over Edinboro to wrap up second place in the PSAC West for the Golden Eagles. Huether completed 14-of-24 passes (58.3 percent) for 169 yards and ran 16 times for 91 yards (5.7 ypc) and three touchdowns. Two of his TD runs came in the second half as he helped rally the Golden Eagles from a 17-6 halftime deficit and scored 24 unanswered points in the second half. He scored on a five-yard run in the first half, bringing Clarion within 7-6 and his one-yard run near the end of the third quarter on a fourth-and-goal play to cut Edinboro's lead to 17-14. His second one-yard run of the game put the Eagles up for good at 20-17 early in the fourth quarter and capped an 80-yard, 13-play drive in which he was 5-for-5 passing for 50 yards.

PSAC West Defensive Player of the Week Reggie Robinson, Clarion LB, So., Pittsburgh, Pa./Brashear

In his first start of the year at linebacker for the Golden Eagles, Robinson made the most of it as he recorded eight tackles (four solo), one tackle for loss and blocked a punt to help Clarion top Edinboro 30-17. His tackle for loss in the first quarter on Edinboro's first drive of the game stopped the Fighting Scots' Trevor Harris on a fourth-and-goal play from the Edinboro 2-yardline for a two-yard loss, stopping the drive. In the fourth quarter, he blocked an Edinboro punt that went out of the end zone for a Clarion safety, giving the Golden Eagles a 22-17 lead with 3:51 left in the game.

PSAC started the year with four teams in the AFCA and five in the D2football.com poll.

California is now the top-ranked PSAC team in both polls, rising two spots to No. 18 in the AFCA poll and two spots to No. 12 in the D2football.com poll. Bloomsburg, which was ranked as high as third in both polls this year, fell to 19th in the AFCA poll and 22nd in the D2football.com poll. Shippensburg entered both polls for the first time this year at No. 23 in the AFCA and No. 24 in the D2football.com poll.

Week 8 was a week for some big offensive performances all around the PSAC. Bloomsburg K Jon Koenig booted a career-long 50-yard field goal on September 19 in the Huskies' win over Kutztown. It marked the third straight year that a

PSAC kicker made a field goal from at least 50 yards but it also marked only the fifth FG made from 50+ yards in the PSAC in the last nine seasons dating back to 2000. Streaks

There are a couple of streaks that are currently active, some of which teams want to keep going, and others that teams want to break. California has a 20-game winning streak in PSAC West play, which it will take into next season with PSAC divisional play having wrapped up for the season. On the opposite end, Cheyney will take a 23-game losing streak in PSAC East play into next season and the Wolves are also looking to break an overall 27-game losing streak. Lock Haven will take a 14-game losing streak in PSAC West play into next season and will have one more chance to break an overall 20-game losing streak.

Bloomsburg Huskies

The Huskies suffered their biggest defeat (16 points) since a 2007 match up against West Chester when they lost by 16 points...Bloomsburg has dropped consecutive games for the first time early in the 2007 season...The Huskies have not dropped three consecutive games since the 1993 season...QB Dan Latorre passed for a career-high 350 yards and went over 7,000 yards for his career. He now has 7,265 career passing yards and is just 210 yards shy of passing Eric Miller for the school's all-time lead in the category...TB Stefan Adams caught a career-high six passes in the game with West Chester...LB Anthony Smith had 11 tackles against WCU making it six games this season that the senior has surpassed 10 tackles in a game...K Jon Koenig connected on two more extra points and now has made 91 straight dating back to the 2007 season.

California Vulcans

Cal U has earned five-straight PSAC West titles, including three-consecutive outright crowns after Saturday's win over Mercyhurst...Cal U will make its second-straight appearance and four overall in the PSAC Championship...The Vulcans will face former divisional rival Shippensburg in next week's PSAC Championship...Despite Cal U winning the last three meetings, Shippensburg lead the all-time series 41-28-1...The Vulcans have posted three-straight undefeated seasons in divisional play and won a total of 19-straight games against PSAC West opponents...LB Dontey Brown recorded 17 tackles (seven solo) against Mercyhurst, the most by a Vulcan since 2004...After having only three interceptions in the first eight games of the year, Cal U has seven interceptions in the last two weeks...The Lakers' Ben Jennings became the first player this season to rush for 100 yards against the Vulcans.



Cheyney Wolves

Joe Morris registered a season high eight solo tackles to go with an interception...John Newman's 81 yards rushing was a season high as was his 75 scamper around right end to set up the Wolves first quarter touchdown...Stan Banks recorded his third interception of the season. He leads Cheyney in that category...Tim Hume recorded sacks on back to back plays. He now has four on the year, second on the Wolves...Cheyney recorded four sacks, tying a season high...Cheyney rushed the ball 30 times, a season low...The time of next week's game against Clarion has been moved up to noon in O'Shields-Stevenson Stadium on the Cheyney campus...The Wolves will honor the 10 seniors on the team in a pre-game ceremony.

Clarion Golden Eagles

Clarion toppled #21 ranked Edinboro 30-17...The win secured second place in the PSAC West for the Golden Eagles...Tyler Huether rushed for 3 TDs and 91 yards, plus hit on 14 of 24 passes for 169 yards...He is second all-time at Clarion in completions, attempts and passing yards with 469 of 908 passes for 5,709 yards and 29 TDs...Alfonso Hoggard rushed for 99 yards and a TD...He now has 944 rushing yards and 14 TDs this season...Jacques Robinson had 6 grabs for 65 yards...He has 62 catches, 715 yards, 4 TDs in 2009...155 career catches (4th career), surpassing former greats Steve Witte (149; 92-96) and Ron Urbansky (149; 86-89) - and 1,795 receiving yards (7th)...Clarion has won five in a row for the first time since 1996...Last six-game win streak was in 1992...Clarion visits Cheyney at noon next Saturday.



C.W. Post Pioneers

C.W. Post won its third straight game with a 42-17 win at home against Kutztown Saturday afternoon...Jr. QB Eric Anderkwavich completed four touchdown passes and rushed in two more...Anderkwavich completed the game with 65 rushing yards and completed 21 of 33 pass attempts for 302 yards and four touchdowns...Anderkwavich has passed for 1,795 yards this season and is ranked third in the PSAC with a 146.4 pass efficiency rating...On the receiving end was junior Darnal Williams who caught eight passes for 111 yards and two

touchdowns...Sr. OLB Tayrance Smith and Gr. LB Peter Manns each made 10 tackles on the day...The Pioneers remain the top offensive team in the PSAC (413.5 yds/game) and lead the conference in rushing yards with 218 yards a game...C.W. Post closes out the regular season next week with a meeting at home against Lock Haven.

East Stroudsburg Warriors

ESU outgained Millersville 504-227 and Fr. TBs Eric Deery (18 carries, 102 yards) and Kendrick Williams (19-96, 1 TD) starred in ESU's 44-3 win...ESU forced four turnovers and leads the PSAC with 26 takeaways...Jr. WR Ed Kiser went over 1,000 career receiving yards (1,042), joining Sr. Sam Shuman (1,966) and Jr. Jeff Giglio (1,647)...Jr. QB Matt Marshall can become the fourth Warrior QB with 2,500 passing yards next week, entering with 2,353 yards and 20 TD...Jr. OLB Matt Freed went over 100 tackles for the second straight season with 126 last year and 101 this year (first ESU player since Kevin Nagle, 1998-2000)...Jr. DE Jeff Case had three sacks...Head coach Denny Douds (SRU '63) hosts his alma mater next Saturday...Douds is 2-8 vs. the Rock with a 38-21 win on the road last year.



Edinboro Fighting Scots

Edinboro saw its six-game winning streak against Clarion snapped in the 30-17 loss to the Golden Eagles...Edinboro led 17-6 at the half, but with QB Trevor Harris on the sideline with an injury Clarion outscored the Fighting Scots 24-0...Edinboro outgained Clarion 172 yards to 72 yards in the first half, but the Fighting Scots managed just 63 yards and five first downs in the second half, with three of the first downs via penalty...Harris moved into 11th place in NCAA Division II in career yards passing (10,971) and career total offense (11,713) before departing late in the first half...He also saw his streak of games with at least one touchdown pass come to an end at 34...Edinboro was minus four starters on defense due to injuries...CB Brandon Williams scored his fourth career touchdown when he returned a fumble three yards for a touchdown.

Gannon Golden Knights

Gannon extended its win streak to three games with a 29-3 victory at IUP. It marks the program's first three-game win streak since the program won its final two games in 2004 and first contest in 2005...In the process, the Golden Knights held their opponent to three points or less in back-to-back games for the first time in a season since opening the 1993 campaign with back-to-back shutouts of St. Francis (Pa.) (20-0) and Waynesburg (9-0)...Jr. Parris Williams recorded his first two career interceptions...Jr. Zach Boedicker accounted for at least three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) for the second time in three weeks...So. Randy Colling recorded career-highs in tackles (7) and tackles for a loss (3)...Sr. TB Jon Richardson needs 134 yards in the season finale at Bloomsburg to become the fifth player in school history to record a 1,000-yard rushing season.



IUP Crimson Hawks

IUP will have its first losing season since 1982 after dropping to 4-6 with a 29-3 loss to Gannon...The Crimson Hawks were held to 116 yards of total offense, the lowest since gaining 94 versus Edinboro in 1981...Tobias Robinson rushed for 33 yards and increased his total to 2,142 to climb to ninth in school history...Mychal Skinner became the 14th IUP player with 100 receptions, finishing the day with 101...Craig Burgess kicked his 29th field goal to tie Josh Telenko for second place, one behind record holder John Sandstrom...IUP wraps up its season Saturday with its first trip to Kutztown since 1986.

Kutztown Golden Bears

Chris McCormick caught his sixth touchdown pass of the season...Kutztown finished with a 2-4 road record...Kevin Morton has thrown for at least 200 yards in three straight games...Overall, he has thrown for at least 200 yards in



four of his starts...Shane Martin has caught 24 passes this season...Kutztown does not have any return yardage on any of their turnovers gained...Matt Dineen extended his single-season field goal school record to 15...Jr. Khalief Evans finished with a season-high 11 tackles against C.W. Post...Kevin Bolinsky collected another sack against C.W. Post. He has 8.5 sacks this season...The Golden Bears are 1-3 at home this season...Kutztown has allowed 42 points in consecutive games, the first time since 2006 that Kutztown has allowed teams to score 40 or more points in consecutive weeks.



Lock Haven Bald Eagles

Lock Haven lost its 20th straight game on Saturday, as the Bald Eagles fell to visiting Slippery Rock 47-6...Lock Haven falls to 0-9 overall and 0-7 in PSAC West play...Lock Haven got a tremendous effort from senior Dean Tortorice, who made a game-high nine stops. Tortorice made his final game at home a memorable one and finished with eight solo stops, two tackles for a loss and a forced fumble, as he did everything he could to help Lock Haven's effort...Wes Plummer was solid for LHU and made seven tackles, including six solo stops and one tackle for a loss. Lock Haven closes out the season next weekend at C.W. Post.

Mercyhurst Lakers

Mercyhurst dropped a 28-7 decision at No. 20 California... it was just the second time this season that Mercyhurst had been held to seven points... The other was a 17-7 decision to then-ranked No. 5 Bloomsburg...TE Josh Szeluga posted the Lakers only score with a receiving touchdown that moved him into a tie for the team lead with three touchdown receptions...Ryan Taylor recorded his first career interception...RB Ben Jennings posted his second +100 yard rushing game of the season...the Lakers conclude the 2009 season against West Chester... It will be the first career meeting between the two teams as the Golden Rams were scheduled to play Mercyhurst but instead advanced to the State Game a year ago.



Millersville Marauders

Millersville rushed for more than 100 yards for the fifth time in the last six games and was led by Brad Lantz's 82 yards, which gives him 2,566 for his career and moves him into fourth place on Millersville's career rushing list. He also totaled 106 all-purpose yards to move him into seventh place among Millersville's career leaders...Fr. Pat Maloney recorded the first double-digit tackle performance of his career with 15...After totaling 10 tackles in the first seven weeks of the season, Maloney has 26 stops in the last three weeks...Ryan Christian also matched a career high with 13 tackles, and he has had 10 or more tackles in back-to-back games...Julius Carter intercepted a pass, giving him two on the season and marking the first time in his four-year career he has picked off two passes in the same year...Four Millersville players now have two interceptions...Shane Gross' sack was his fourth of the year. He had zero career sacks entering the 2009 season.



Shippensburg Red Raiders

Shippensburg earned its first divisional championship since 2004 and will play in its first conference championship game in 28 years...By virtue of West Chester's 30-14 victory over Bloomsburg, the Red Raiders earned their first outright divisional title since winning the Western Division in 1981...Saturday marked Shippensburg's first game at Cheyney in 21 years...Fr. Kevin Herod battled for a career-high 112 yards on 27 carries with one touchdown, averaging 4.1 yards per carry...SU has reached 8+ wins for the 10th time in school history and the first since 2004...The Red Raiders have thrown 23 touchdown passes this season, the most in a campaign since 1999 and the third-most in SU single-season history...Eight of Sr. TE Mark Rossi's 17 receptions this season have been for touchdowns...SU will host California (Pa.) on Saturday...The Vulcans have won the last three meetings between the teams.



Slippery Rock - The Rock



The Rock defense forced Lock Haven into 11 fumbles Saturday, four of which The Rock recovered; recorded six QB sacks for minus-47 yards, blocked three punts and intercepted one pass en route holding the Bald Eagles to minus-11 yards in total offense ... The win, SRU's 21st straight against LHU, assured The Rock of a winning season ... Akeem Satterfield scored his first two collegiate rushing TDs and went over the 100-yard for the first time in his career with 107 yards on 19 carries ... True freshman QB Ryan O'Rourke passed for 124 yards and one TD in his first collegiate start ... Defensively, Scott Kachurik had four tackles for loss, Andre Freeman blocked two punts and Pat Marsilio had two QB sacks ... Saturday's win extended SRU's unbeaten streak vs. LHU to 29 seasons ... The Rock visits East Stroudsburg, coached by SRU Hall of Famer Denny Douds, in the season finale next Saturday.

West Chester Golden Rams

West Chester downed visiting Bloomsburg, 30-14, Saturday at John A. Farrell Stadium...The win was West Chester's third in the last four meetings against Bloomsburg...Bloomsburg has not beaten West Chester at Farrell Stadium since 2000 (4-0)...WCU head coach Bill Zwaan is now 5-4 against Bloomsburg...Bloomsburg's 47 yards rushing marked the third straight week that WCU has allowed fewer than 100 yards rushing to an opponent and the seventh time overall this year...West Chester's 30 points were the most allowed by Bloomsburg all year...WR Dan DePalma recorded his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the year and his second multi-TD game...QB Joe Wright threw for a season-high 326 yards.

What to Expect

After starting the year strong before hitting a midyear skid, Gannon appears to have gotten back on the tracks as the Golden Knights have won three straight, putting up three of their best offensive performances of the year, and is looking for its first winning season since 2003. Bloomsburg, after an 8-0 start, has lost two in a row and after being ranked first in the country in scoring defense, has given up their two largest point totals of the year in the last two weeks and needs a win to remain in contention for NCAA playoff berth.

Gannon's current three-game winning streak has coincided with its running game getting back in full gear, as the Knights have gone for 311, 256 and 246 yards in their last three games to rise all the way to the second-best running game in the PSAC. RB Jon Richardson will be looking for a big game in which to wrap his college career and with a couple of scores, has a chance to finish first in the league in touchdowns scored, while QB Zach Boedicker has at times this year, particularly over the last three weeks, been a bigger threat running the ball than throwing it. Although Bloom has given up its two largest point totals in the last two weeks, the Huskies have still had a solid rush defense, having allowed an opponent to rush for over 100 yards just five times this year, so the Golden Knights may need to throw the ball more, as that is the weaker part of the Huskies' defense, but it is also the weaker point of Gannon's offense.

Bloomsburg had its vaunted rushing attack shut down last week, failing to go over 100 yards for the first time this season. In place of that, the Huskies threw for over 200 yards, for the first time this year, but much of that was due to playing from behind after its defense allowed West Chester to take a sizable lead. The Huskies may find it a bit easier to run against Gannon, which has one of the worst rush defenses in the league, and a pass defense that is ranked right in the middle. However, the Knights have turned in their two best defensive performances of the year in the last weeks, holding both opponents under 200 yards of total offense, so the Huskies may have their work cut out for them.

Both teams have big-play threats on special teams, with Tyler Batts of Gannon averaging 12.3 ypr on punts and 21.1 ypr on kicks, although Gannon as a team averages just 18.3 ypr on kicks. Brandon Real has taken over much of the kick returns for Bloom and averages 19.0 ypr on punts and 22.5 on kicks.

What to Expect

Edinboro is coming off a disappointing loss that likely ended its playoff hopes and in which it lost QB Trevor Harris to an injury and struggled moving the ball on offense after his injury. Millersville has had a couple of bright spots this season, more than last year at least, and will be looking to finish strong as the program looks to take another step forward in the rebuilding process.

This is a matchup of two teams that have struggled running the ball this year but in each opposing defense will be going up against a unit that has struggled stopping the run this year. Edinboro, which has struggled with injuries in its backfield this year, may need to run the ball effectively if Harris is unable to go and they will be going up against the PSAC's worst rush defense, so RB David Bostic may get quite a few carries. The Marauder defense has given up at least 200 yards rushing in all but one game this season.

Edinboro's rush defense has had issues this year as well, as it is ranked only a few spots above Millersville, having given up at least 150 yards rushing in six out of 10 games this year. With that in mind, the Marauders may try to pound the ball with RBs Brad Lantz and Cardoza Jacks although Millersville's running game is ranked second-to-last in the league. Their passing game has been more effective than the run, particularly when QB Bill Shirk throws the ball to WR Jamal Smith, but the Fighting Scots are best against the pass and Smith is likely to match up against CB Branden Williams, one of the top cover corners in the PSAC.

The Fighting Scots have the second-best punt return unit in the league, averaging 15.9 ypr behind Ben Swank's 21.8 average, but the Scots have returned just 10 punts this year, the third-fewest in the league. That area could be a game-changer because Millersville allows an average of 7.2 ypr, the worst in the league. Despite having a couple of big play threats on kick returns in Michael Battles and Williams, Edinboro averages just 19.2 ypr on kicks. Millersville also has a pair of big-play threats in kicks in Lou Brown (19.6 ypr) and Smith (21.3 ypr) but averages just 19.4 as a team. Brown averages a decent 8.0 ypr on punts, but Millersville has returned just 13 as a team.

What to Expect

Clarion, which is on its longest winning streak since 1996, is looking to end the year on a six-game winning streak, which would be its longest since 1992. By contrast, Cheyney has extra motivation as it is looking to avoid its second straight winless season.

The Wolves' main problem on defense this year has been stopping the run, as its pass defense has been decent at times. Since that is the case, Clarion will likely give Cheyney a large dose of Alfonso Hoggard, the PSAC's leading rusher in average yards per game, who also has the second-most carries of any PSAC back. He is just 56 yards shy of 1,000 for the season and is the only PSAC back that is averaging over 100 ypg. QB Tyler Huether also showcased an ability to run the ball effectively last week but if the Golden Eagles elect to pass, they are most potent in that area, with WR Jacques Robinson ranking second in the league in catches.

Clarion's defense is one of the most improved in the PSAC this year, and the Golden Eagles have been particularly good at stopping the run, especially late in the season, as they have allowed over 150 yards of rushing to an opponent just three times overall this year, and just once in its last eight games. That does not bode well for Cheyney, which relies almost exclusively on the run to move the football. They have one of the best running games in the league behind RB Ron Hunter and QB Angel Rodriguez, who have combined for over 1,000 rushing yards on the season and have helped Cheyney's running game rank in the upper half of the PSAC. Clarion's pass defense is a bit more vulnerable, but Cheyney averages fewer than 100 ypg through the air, worst in the league.

Hoggard gives Clarion the edge on special teams as he averages 26.9 ypr on kicks, while Cheyney averages just 16.9 ypr on kicks as a team and does not have a kick return of longer than 30 yards. Hoggard, who leads the PSAC in all-purpose yardage per game by a large margin, also averages 5.6 ypr on punts, while Cheyney has returned just four punts on the year but have averaged 11.0 ypr on those punts. Both teams' kicking games are solid

What to Expect

This game has more meaning for East Stroudsburg as the Warriors enter the game holding down the sixth and final NCAA playoff spot in the region, so a win is a must for them to have any chance at a bid. Slippery Rock was also in playoff position earlier in the season before going on a three-game losing streak but with a win in its finale, can post a two-game improvement over last year and end the year on a two-game winning streak.

The most intriguing matchup in this game is East Stroudsburg's top-ranked passing game going up against one of the top pass defenses in the league in Slippery Rock. The Rock is giving up nearly 100 fewer yards per game through the air than ESU is averaging, so something will likely have to give in that matchup. The Warriors will likely turn to the freshman tandem of Kendrick Williams and Eric Deery in the backfield with leading rusher Zach Krise likely out for the year having not played in the last four games. That duo may be important is Rock is able to contain ESU's passing game, as Rock is not as good at stopping the run.

East Stroudsburg has had an inconsistent defense this year and that unit will be going up against a Slippery Rock offense that also has been inconsistent this year. Both units have turned in outstanding performances this year and both have turned in not-so-good ones as well. Which unit turns in the better performance may decide this game, as East Stroudsburg is just 1-3 this year when giving up more than 25 points in a game but it undefeated when giving up fewer than 25 while Rock's offense has generated as few as 105 yards in a game this year (in a win) and as many as 468 (in a loss). They will likely look to attack the Warriors' pass defense that is giving up almost 200 ypg with WRs Devin Goda and Jermale Cromerdie, although they are primarily a running team with Sayquan Scott-Mitchell and Damarcus Cleckley.

Akeem Satterfield has emerged as a big-play threat on kick returns for Rock, averaging 28.2. Rock has an advantage there as ESU averages just 20.2 ypr on kicks as a team, with none having gone for more than 37 yards. Rock has nearly a three-yard advantage in net punts but gives up over three yards more per return.

What to Expect

Lock Haven will be looking to avoid its second straight winless season but on paper, are a mismatch against C.W. Post, which having already wrapped up its first winning season in PSAC East play, will be looking for its first overall winning season since joining the PSAC last year.

The Pioneers continue to have the league's best rushing game behind the potent duo of RB Thomas Beverly, who leads the PSAC in overall rushing yards, and QB Eric Anderwkavich, who leads all PSAC quarterbacks in rushing yardage. That duo will be going up against a Lock Haven defense that has given up the third-most rushing yards in the PSAC and gives up an average of 5.3 yards per carry, while the Pioneers average 5.0 yards per carry, tops in the league. Lock Haven is better against the pass, allowing fewer passing yards than rushing yards on average, while Anderwkavich has completed almost 60 percent of his passes and has 20 TD passes to just five interceptions and with two top targets in WRs Chris Harris and Darnal Williams, can throw the ball effectively if needed as well, as the Pioneers have the most offensive yards of any PSAC team this year.

Lock Haven's defense, which has struggled all year long, has especially struggled in recent weeks after starting QB Jarret Kratzer and starting RB Ibrahim Smith were both lost for the season due to injuries. In Kratzer's absence, the Bald Eagles have used three different QBs in the last two weeks, Jarryd Burkett, Josh Walters and Shawn Faulk. The running game is now average negative yardage per game, partially due to Lock Haven allowing a league-leading 43 sacks. Their only offense has been through the air, but C.W. Post comes in with the league's top pass defense, so the Bald Eagles may find it tough moving the ball on offense once again.

Juma McKenley's 23.0 ypr average on kickoff gives Post a big play threat on special teams, but the Pioneers average just 18.2 ypr on kicks as a team while LHU averages just 17.0. Post does not have a punt return for more than 15 yards this year and averages just 4.5 ypr as a team on punts while the Bald Eagles have returned just nine punts, and none for more than nine yards. Both teams have had issues in the kicking game this year, as Post's two kickers, Justin Bertone and Jon Korn, have combined to go just 2-for-5 on FGs and 33-for-40 on PATs, while Lock Haven is yet to make a FG this year in three attempts and is 4-for-5 on PATs. The two teams are last (LHU) and second-to-last (CWP) in net punting average.

What to Expect

This will be a matchup of a pair of teams that have had disappointing seasons in which neither lived up to expectations that they had entering the season. After promising starts to the season, the two teams have combined to go 3-13 from Week 3 through now.

Much of IUP's struggles can be attributed to its offense, which lost its starting quarterback and has struggled scoring points all year, even when Andrew Krewatch was playing. Not surprisingly, it is the passing game that has struggled the most, generating under 150 ypg. The Crimson Hawks will likely need to do more through the air against the Golden Bears, who own the league's worst pass defense, which is where much of its problems on defense have come from this year. IUP has a decent running game with the duo of Tobias Robinson and Harvie Tuck, which should give them hope on offense going into next year, but for now, Kutztown has one of the best rush defenses in the PSAC, so the Crimson Hawks may need to throw the ball effectively to have success in this game.

Kutztown QB Kevin Morton has given the Golden Bears' passing game a boost ever since becoming the starter in the fourth game of the season and the freshman's efforts this year have given KU hope for the future. For now, the Golden Bears may have some trouble moving the ball against the Crimson Hawks, who have played solid defense for most of the year despite their record. They have the league's second best pass defense, led by lockdown CB Akwasi Owusu-Ansah. Perhaps Kutztown's biggest disappointment this year has been how its running game has fallen off. After starting off quite well, the Golden Bears are now only ranked around the middle of the league in rushing, as RB Dontay Wilson will finish the year with far fewer yards than last year. IUP is not an easy team to run the football against either, as it allowed just under five ypg more than Kutztown.

Both teams have outstanding kick returners and strong and reliable kickers, so one big play could make the difference with both teams struggling on offense. Owusu-Ansah has five TD returns this year and averages 28.9 ypr on kicks and 12.9 ypr on punts. Kendell Coleman averages 10.0 ypr on punts and 24.9 ypr on kicks. IUP K Craig Burgess is 7-for-9 on FGs and a perfect 28-for-28 on PATs while KU K Matt Dineen leads the PSAC in FGs made as he is 15-of-17 but has missed four PATs, going just 19-for-23.

What to Expect

This game will be a match between a pair of teams that had playoff aspirations coming into the season but inconsistent play derailed those hopes by mid-way through the season. Both teams will be looking to finish the season strong.

Much of the Lakers' struggles this season have been due to their offense, which has struggled scoring points this year, as they have scored over 30 points just once this year and have been held to 20 or fewer points in six games. Turnovers have also been a problem as the Lakers have the most interceptions thrown (15) in the PSAC. They will have their work cut out for them in the Golden Rams, who have the league's best total defense, allowing just 265 yards per game. They also have the league's best rushing offense, so Mercyhurst will likely find it difficult to run the ball, as the Rams have held their opponent under 100 yards rushing in seven out of 10 games this year.

West Chester's offense revolves almost completely around the pass. Despite having a plethora of options in the backfield, the Rams are ranked only 11th in rushing offense, a number that has gone down as the year has gone on despite having two solid backs with contrasting styles in RBs D'Andre Webb and Lee Hopkins. However, the Rams bread and butter this year has been throwing the ball, as QB Joe Wright leads the PSAC in passing yards and has two top targets in WRs Steve Miller and Dan DePalma, who combine for over 140 ypg in receiving and have a combined 15 TD grabs this year. West Chester will likely look to throw the ball frequently once again, as Mercyhurst is far better against the run than they are against the pass.

The Golden Rams have the top punt returner in the league in Kevin Garland, who averages 22.8 ypr, but Mercyhurst gives up just 1.4 ypr on punts, so that will make for an interesting matchup. On kicks, Garland has the most returns but has averaged just 18.5 ypr while DePalma averages 24.7 ypr. K Chris Hill is just 5-for-10 on FGs and 39-for-43 on PATs. The Lakers have an explosive threat returning kicks in Andrew Bailey, who averages 27.7 ypr and has one for a TD this year. Paris Bruner averages 6.4 ypr on punts while K Robert Giambra is 5-for-8 on FGs and 18-for-23 on PATs.

What to Expect

This game for the PSAC championship will be between a pair of teams that are very evenly matched on both offense and special teams, as both teams have numbers that are very similar in those two categories. Shippensburg has won two games this year in which it failed to go over 100 yards rushing and that was largely because of its passing game, which is also solid behind QB Chad DiFebbo, whose 22 TD passes this year are second in the PSAC only to Josh Portis of Cal. The matchup of WR Mike Harris, the PSAC's leading receiver, going up against an outstanding cover CB in Terrence Johnson could be one that could have an impact on the game.

California's offense has been a fine-tuned machine lately, particularly as its running game has gotten stronger. RBs Freddie Bacco and Windell Brown have played as well as they have all season in recent weeks and Ship gives up over 40 yards more per game on the ground than Cal, so how well Cal is able to run the ball and keep possession of the ball to keep Ship's potent offense off the field may be the difference in the game, while Cal's passing game has three speedy and explosive weapons in A.J. Jackson, Terrance Moore, and Chedrick Cherry, while Portis is a dual threat to run the ball as well and has just six interceptions, which may come into play as well since Ship leads the PSAC with 13 picks.

Ship and Cal have the two best kick return units in the PSAC and both average nearly the same ypr on punts as well. Cal averages nearly two yards more on net punts than Ship, while both teams have solid and accurate kickers.

Series/Game Notes

Shippensburg leads California 41-28-1 in the all-time series...Both schools played in the PSAC West up until last year when the Red Raiders moved over to the East...The teams met for 54 consecutive years from 1954-2007...Cal has won the last three meetings between the two teams...Prior to that, Shippensburg won 13 straight meetings from 1991-2003.
